Pastor's Report

Surrendering to the Holy Spirit



Have you ever been on a roller coaster and wondered who was in control? The answer is always the same—not you! There's something terrifying about not having control. What about the control of our life? In one sense, we have no control over the temptations that suddenly appear or the troubles that unexpectedly come our way. In another sense, we do have control of the fact that we can avoid what we know that might trip us up, and we also have the power of the Holy Spirit living in us.

It is clear from words of Jesus himself (John: 15:26-27) that God promises to give the Holy Spirit to people. What the spirit will do when he comes is anybody's guess. The Holy Spirit resides within us in power and wants to flow out through us to others. We don't need to strain; we just need to **surrender**. Our focus needs to be to turn our attention to the person of the Spirit who already resides fully within us. We cannot attain the presence of God because we're already totally in the presence of God. What's absent is **awareness**. Little do we realize that God is maintaining us in existence with every breath we take. As we take another breath it means that God is choosing us now and now and now." Jesus said, "Remain in me, and I will remain in you." (John 15:4) We need to still our hearts, quiet our minds, relax our bodies, and turn our spirit towards the wonderful Holy Spirit who lives within us..... and surrender.

I have yet to meet someone who does not want more of the Holy Spirit in their life. How about you? What if in surrendering you are transformed?

Saturday, May 4th Noon-2:00 pm


(Please bring your items to the far side of the playground. We will unload your car to bring in those doors at that end of the church to store in our confirmation room).


Camp prices vary; a few examples are listed below.




The Day of Pentecost
